Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) & Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Course

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) course is conducted in both English and Mandarin. CPR+AED is a 4-hour course covering emergency procedures such as CPR and operating the AED. Course are taught through theory lessons, practical sessions, and case studies.

Eligibility for Enrolment

Participant must attain at least Secondary Two education otherwise would be a level 5 in Employability Skills System (ESS) Workplace Literacy and Numeracy.

Certification Validity

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be issued with a credit card sized certificate which is valid for 2 years.

Target Audience

This course is opened to individual with interest in first aid who is voluntary or complying to requirements. The individual must be physically fit and able to render emergency help to another individual.

Training Outcomes

Upon passing the course, participants will be qualified as first responders to:

- perform CPR and operate the AED

- Demonstration of CPR+AED
- Hands-on practice of CPR+AED
