Presentation of Colours

Restructuring of **St John Brigade** to adapt to changing demographics.

On 19th February 2022, St John Singapore marked the restructuring of the Brigade with the Presentation of new Colours to its Brigade HQ and five newly formed Districts. The Guest-of-Honour, **President Halimah Yacob**, was hosted by St John Council Chairman, Dr Selan Sayampanathan and Brigade Chief Commissioner, Dr Nelson Chua.

The parade and ceremony kicked off in the afternoon with the Consecration of Colours Ceremony where the new Colours were blessed by St John Singapore's spiritual counselors. The two parade contingents comprised members from the CHIJ St Nicholas Corps and adult NCOs across the five districts. President Halimah Yacob presented the newly consecrated Colours to the Brigade Secretary and the five District Commissioners in a dignified parade at the St John Headquarters Parade Square.

The event was livestreamed with an outreach of more than 1,500 viewers, allowing Brigade members who were unable to be physically present at the parade to still participate via *Facebook Live*.

Following the presentation of new Colours, President Halimah Yacob embarked on the **St John Singapore Heritage Trail**, where she learnt about St John Singapore's rich history since 1885. Thereafter, members of the Council, Brigade, Association, and Board of Presidents had the opportunity of interacting with President Halimah Yacob both in person and virtually. They shared their volunteering experiences at St John Singapore with her.

To conclude the event, President Halimah Yacob and Dr Selan Sayampanathan unveiled an oil painting, which carried a symbolic meaning. The painting illustrated the long and rich history of St John Singapore, its contribution to Total Defence, the delivery of quality first aid and home nursing training, and the organization's current role in Singapore's fight against COVID-19.







The event marked a significant milestone for the Brigade's restructuring journey to better meet Singapore's evolving demographics and improve St John Singapore's outreach and community engagement efforts.
