RENDERING ASSISTANCE TO MINISTRY OF HEALTH

St John Responder Unit (SJRU), the main operational unit of St John Brigade, has been performing first aid public duties for various community and national events. During the circuit breaker last year, it was also mobilised to assist a medical team at the frontlines of the nation-wide fight against COVID- 19.

SJRU coordinated with the Ministry of Health (MOH) before the circuit breaker and was mobilised to assist the Healthcare Volunteer Corps. In particular, a SJRU- coordinated group was on-call daily to support MOH on a need-to basis. Subsequently, a team comprising 4 SJRU and District officers, who are not healthcare professionals, was attached to the Mobile Medical team of Changi General Hospital that was assigned to take care of COVID-19 patients in dormitories.

UP-CLOSE WITH COVID-19 PATIENTS AT DORMITORIES

Going into foreign worker dormitories during the surge in COVID-19 was not an easy decision to make but I am glad I did it with the support from my family and friends.

Attached to Changi General Hospital (CGH), we went into the foreign worker dormitories to assist the medical team manned by volunteers from various departments of CGH. This team takes care of the foreign workers during their insolation or recovery. We assisted the team with vital sign taking, preparation of medication, simple wound treatment, COVID swab tests and any emergency treatment.

My most meaningful moment was my encounter with a Malaysian Chinese foreign worker who is both deaf and mute. He can only understand sign language and simple Malay words. To carry out a swab for him, I had to spend longer time to explain the procedure and things to expect in the next few days. It was not easy, but he was such a good patient. He trusted us to lead him through the whole process. When his 5-day isolation ended, he made his way back to the medical post just to pass me a "Thank You" note. At that moment, everything is worth it.

I strongly encourage our volunteers to step forward and make a difference if the situation allows.

IN MEMORIAM TO THE LATE MR FOO SI KWANG, KStJ

Mr Foo Si Kwang, KStJ, a veteran with the St John movement for more than 50 years, passed away on 15 November 2020.

Mr Foo joined the St John Ambulance Division of River Valley Secondary School in 1964 and subsequently served with St John Headquarters as a staff officer from 1981 to 1995 and as Chairman of St John Fellowship (SJF) and a Council Member for 24 years since 1996. He was instrumental in establishing SJF as a strong service arm of St John Singapore, spearheading fund-raising projects for St John and reaching out to the community through social events. He was elected to be the Vice Chairman of the Council at the AGM held on 28 October 2020.

In view of his dedication and devoted services, he was awarded the Serving Brother of The Order of St John in 1999 and subsequently promoted to Officer Brother, Commander Brother and Knight of Grace in 2004, 2010 and 2018 respectively.

The demise of Mr Foo is a great loss to St John Singapore.

COMMISSION CEREMONY OF 28TH OFFICER TRAINING COURSE

To make the online ceremony just as memorable as the traditional parade, it was broadcasted live on the St John Singapore Facebook page, where parents of the trainees received the e-invitation. During the ceremony held on 19 December 2020, all the 61 course participants recited their WHY statements with gusto to the audiences, including their parents, friends and seniors from St John. Their audio recordings were then pieced together as one majestic recitation of the Officer's Creed for the livestream. At the end of the ceremony, the newly commissioned officers proceeded to put on their new ranks from the comforts of their homes and celebrate the proud moment with their loved ones in quiet intimacy.
