### Chairman's Message

It is my privilege to present the St John Singapore Annual Report 2025, reflecting on a year of resilience, transformation and renewed commitment to serving our community.

One of the most significant milestones during the year was the successful completion of the major upgrading and renovation of the St John Singapore Dementia Day Care Centre (SJSDGCC). Commencing in late September 2024 and with the major works completed in July 2025, this transformative project marks a new chapter in our dementia care journey.

Throughout the eleven-month renovation period, our Dementia Day Care Centre continued its services from a temporary location in Bedok through the generous support and hospitality of St Andrew Senior Care Services. On behalf of St John Singapore, I extend our deepest appreciation to St Andrew Senior Care Services for their unwavering partnership, kindness and collaboration, which ensured uninterrupted care for our clients during this transition.

The newly upgraded SJSDGCC represents a significant investment in the future of dementia care. Designed with the needs, dignity and well-being of persons living with dementia at its core, the Centre now has the capacity to expand our services progressively to accommodate up to 120 clients, representing a fourfold increase from our previous capacity. The modern facilities include purpose-built activity spaces, automatic showering facilities and a new fleet of dementia and wheelchair-friendly transport vehicles, enabling seamless home-to-centre transportation while enhancing the overall quality of care delivered to our clients and their families.

Equally encouraging was the successful return of our fundraising efforts following the challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. On 3 October 2025, St John Singapore organised the "Hearts For Hope" Charity Dinner in support of the SJSDGCC. This marked our first fundraising event since 2020 (and was made possible through the dedication and leadership of Ms Bella Tan, then Designated Director of the SJSDGCC,) together with an outstanding team of volunteers, donors and supporters.

The event raised a net total of **S\$55,317.51**, funds that will directly strengthen our ability to provide quality dementia care and support services for our elderly beneficiaries. Every contribution reflects the compassion and generosity of individuals and organisations who share our vision of providing dignity, hope and quality care for those living with dementia. To every sponsor, donor, volunteer and supporter, I extend my heartfelt gratitude.

These achievements remind us that progress is never accomplished by one individual alone. It is built upon the dedication of our volunteers, staff, Council members, healthcare professionals, partners, donors and the wider St John family, all united by

our enduring commitment to Pro Fide, Pro Utilitate Hominum (“For the Faith, In the Service of Humanity”).

As we look ahead, we remain committed to strengthening governance, expanding community services, enhancing volunteer excellence and ensuring that St John Singapore continues to evolve to meet the changing healthcare and social needs of our nation. ## **CORPORATE GOVERNANCE**

### **Registration and Compliance**

The St John Singapore (“SJS” in short) is a Social Service Organisation and registered as a society under the Societies Act on 28 July 1970. It is also registered as a Charity and is recognized as an Institution of Public Character (IPC) which allows our donors to enjoy tax deductions. SJS is governed by the Constitution of SJS and is complying with the Code of Governance for Charities and Institutions of Public Character.

### **Members of the Council**

SJS is governed by the National St John Council of Singapore (NSJCS) whose members are appointed according to the SJS’s Constitution. Being the highest policy and decision-making body of SJS, the NSJCS has the ultimate responsibility of ensuring that SJS is governed and managed responsibly and prudently to ensure the effectiveness, credibility and sustainability of the organisation.

The NSJCS presently comprises the Council Chairman, Vice-Chairmen, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Assistant Honorary Treasurer and other Council Members. The NSJCS charts the overall direction of SJS and is responsible for the promotion of the Policy and Programmes of SJS. It oversees the direction of SJS and ensures that SJS’s principles are adhered to.

### **Election of Office Bearers**

The Chairman and the elected Vice-Chairman are elected in accordance with the SJS Constitution. Two other Vice-Chairmen, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Assistant Honorary Treasurer of the Council are appointed from amongst its members.

### **Sub-Committees**

At the first meeting of the NSJCS immediately following the Annual General Meeting, the Chairman shall appoint such sub-committees as may be deemed necessary. The sub-committees are responsible for overseeing the core issues (specific or assigned) under their purview and provide/recommend policy directions and guidance to the NSJCS and Management.

### **Honorary Treasurer**

The Honorary Treasurer is duly appointed under the Constitution of SJS and shall be responsible for the proper functioning, management and administration of SJS financial matters.

### **Chief Executive Officer**

The Chief Executive Officer supervises the work of all employees. He is in attendance at all meetings of the Council to provide information and Secretariat support.

**Auditor**

The accounts of SJS are audited annually by a public accountant appointed by SJS and approved by the sector administrator.

**Financial Management**

The financial statements of SJS are drawn up in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice (RAP 6) and the Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (FRS).

**Fund Raising and Donations**

SJS has established internal guidelines on fundraising that are adhered to for all fundraising events. These guidelines are based on the best practices set out by the National Council of Social Service and the Charity Council. The committee for each fundraising event consists of volunteers and supported by staff. The donors are informed of our objectives and targets. The funds raised are for supporting programmes and activities in line with the tag line, "Service to Humanity".

**Conflict of Interest**

Policy Every person who has been or will be in any way, whether directly or indirectly, faced with a conflict situation (actual, potential or perceived) are required to make a full and frank disclosure to the parties responsible for making the decision and are excluded from the decision-making process relating to that matter. Immediate family members are treated as an interest of that person, and include the spouse, siblings, parents and children.

All interested person transactions pertaining to staff of SJS must have obtained the prior approval of the Chairman. Interested person transaction pertaining to Council Members must obtain the prior approval of the Chairman and any transaction that the Chairman is an interested person, must obtain the prior approval of the Audit Committee. All Council Members make annual declaration at the beginning of their term. Management staff including staff managing procurement shall also make declarations at the beginning of the year.

**Reserves Policy**

SJS targets to keep about three months of operational expenses as short-term investment in the form of fixed deposits on month-to-month basis with auto rollover; and in fixed deposits for a period of three months and thereon. The rest of the money shall be kept as investment in the following form:

- (a) as capital expenditure for the building
- (b) invest in Government Bonds as a long-term investment
- (c) deposit as long-term Fixed Deposit with the banks for a period of three years and thereon.

### **Designated Fund**

With the transformation of the Zones into Districts, the then Zone 9 Bursary Fund shall be renamed the St John Bursary Fund to provide bursaries and scholarship awards to deserving cadet members in the Brigade. The other recently set up designated funds are the Dementia Centre Resource Fund for the improvements of/new facilities and new programmes, and, the Dementia Centre Operations Supplementary Fund to supplement the operational expenditures of the Centre. The usage of these funds is subjected to specific approval of the NSJCS with effect from 12 November 2020.

### **Reserve & Investment Sub-Committee**

The Reserve & Investment Sub-Committee is appointed by the NSJCS to exercise prudence and good stewardship in relation to the investment of SJS funds to look into generating higher returns in the long run with a reasonable amount of risk.

### **Internal Audit Sub-Committee**

The Internal Audit Sub-Committee is appointed by the NSJCS to assist SJS in fulfilling its oversight responsibilities for the financial reporting process, the system of internal control, the audit process, and SJS's process for monitoring compliance with the laws and regulations and the code of conduct.

### **Whistle Blowing Policy**

SJS whistle blowing policy aims to provide an avenue for staff, volunteers and external parties to raise good faith. This policy covers issues where the following may be suspected:

1. Corruption
2. Acts of fraud
3. Theft and/misuse of SJS's properties, assets or resources
4. Breach of laws

## **Excellence in Service, Leadership in Action**

### **Chief Commissioner's Foreword**

2025 has been a landmark year for St John Brigade Singapore. We deepened our specialisation in areas such as First Aid and Home Nursing and also continued to inspire future generations of leaders. The Brigade has flown the flag high for St John Singapore through our participation in the Singapore-Malaysia First Aid and Nursing Competition held in Kuala Lumpur in July 2025. On the front of keeping St John relevant, our officers and cadets have stepped up in the fight against vaping, through anti-vaping campaigns through community outreach, online publicity, on the radios and even the launch of a comic strip! Looking ahead, the Brigade will continue our pursuit of excellence and our commitment to the motto, *Pro Utilitate Hominum* (For the Service of Mankind).

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## **2. Key Events & Milestones**

### **National First Aid and Home Nursing Competition (NFAC) 2025**

The highly anticipated annual NFAC was held on 24 May 2025 at Ngee Ann Polytechnic. The annual competition saw intense participation from the five districts to take part in the four categories: Ambulance Adult, Nursing Adult, Ambulance Cadet and Nursing Cadet. East District did a sweep of the top spots in all four categories at the NFAC 2025 and also secured the highly coveted opportunity to represent Singapore at the biennial Singapore-Malaysia First Aid and Nursing Competition in July 2025.



### **Singapore-Malaysia First Aid and Nursing Competition 2025**

St John Ambulance Malaysia (SJAM) hosted the Singapore-Malaysia First Aid and Nursing Competition in Petaling Jaya, Malaysia, from 25 to 27 July 2025. The top NFAC teams from Chung Cheng High School (Main) and Dunman High School represented Singapore at this biennial competition between the two nations. The competition further strengthened our ties with our neighbours and allowed our cadets to further deepen their skills in first aid and home nursing. Our Ambulance Adult team also made us proud by bringing home the coveted Lee Kong Chian challenge trophy made of gold! SJBS expresses our deepest appreciation to SJAM for their gracious hospitality and we look forward to hosting the SJAM for the competition in Singapore in 2027.



## St John Day Award Ceremony

The annual ceremony held on 5 July 2025 at the Hwa Chong Institution Auditorium served as the premier platform to honor the dedication of our members who had distinguished themselves. Of note, the key awards that were presented are as follows:
